


### **Preformance**





### **Growth stories**



**Adam Nash** General Manager - Major Projects.

I had the opportunity and privilege to start at Southbase in 2013 as the first Quantity Surveyor. My journey has taken a similar path and trajectory to that of our business, which is now a Tier 1 national business. I started out managing our first large commercial projects (141 and 151 Cambridge Terrace in Christchurch), then moved into a senior QS role managing multiple projects and QS teams. Subsequently, I transitioned into a management role on the South Island leadership team as the Commercial Manager of the South Island, and then into the South Island Regional Manager role, overseeing the general management of the South Island and holding accountability for all operational and commercial aspects of the business. Now, as part of our growth strategy and in response to market-driven demand, we have identified opportunities to secure significant vertical infrastructure projects across New Zealand. I will be overseeing these projects and moving into a General Manager of Major Projects role to ensure we have ample oversight of these forthcoming large national projects, which provide ongoing growth and opportunities for our people.



**Alex Kay** Project Commercial Manager

After beginning my career as a Quantity Surveyor in the UK, I relocated to New Zealand to join Southbase in January 2020. My first Southbase project was the Massey University Innovation Complex - a large-scale laboratory and teaching facility in Auckland. For the first year of the project I was an Intermediate Quantity Surveyor working as part of a commercial team, responsible for procurement of subcontract trade packages and on-site commercial management of subcontract trades. After about a year of working in this position I was promoted to Senior Quantity Surveyor, taking on responsibility for commercial management of the project and managing a small team of quantity surveyors. At the conclusion of the project, I was responsible for agreeing final accounts and commercial closeout, delivering a successful outcome for the client and Southbase.

Following this, I moved to the Project Fern Data Centre (also in Auckland). As lead QS I was responsible for all the day-to-day commercial aspects of the project including management of a team of quantity surveyors, financial reporting, progress and variation claims and agreeing final accounts. On conclusion of this project, I was promoted to Project Commercial Manager and am currently working on the MPI PHEC laboratory and greenhouse project.



Alex Marshall
Senior Quantity Surveyor

I started with Southbase in August 2016 as a Graduate/Junior Quantity Surveyor. I worked within a great team on The Crossing project until the end of 2017, at which point I was offered the opportunity to relocate to Wellington to run my own smaller project. During my two years in Wellington I had the chance to complete four different projects. I then returned to Christchurch and worked on the Linwood College project. Originally this was under a SQS (Geraint), however by the end of the project I was in charge of the day-to-days. Since completing Linwood College I have been involved in close to ten different projects (tenders or live projects). I am now a Senior QS within the company and oversee a number of projects/teams.



**Andrew McMillan** Project Manager

I started with Southbase as a Site Manager on Linwood College, working alongside Jim Western to complete the main structural elements including concrete foundations, slabs, structural steel and level 1 slabs, before starting at Rolleston East School (now known as Te Rohutu Whio), where we completed the project on budget, to a high standard and ahead of programme. Since then, I have worked on numerous projects including in Dunedin on Te Rangihiroa university accommodation and the 18-unit Mosgiel Kainga Ora housing facility. Now I am in Christchurch to project manage for the first time - Ellesmere College. As part of my career progression, I have also completed several internal Southbase competencies which is leading on to a Construction Management Diploma. I have also completed the New Zealand Certificate in Workplace Health and Safety Practice with Site Safe.



**Kat Nelson** Design Manager

I started working for Southbase in May 2017 taking up a Site Engineer role; this was pivotal in my progression, learning and understanding compliance and quality assurance as I moved quickly into a Site Manager role. From here I developed skills like communicating across all levels, and safety and risk management. After having our first child, I reviewed my career progression with the Southbase team, utilising my background in architecture and progressed into a Design Management role. My past experience has helped accelerated my career as a Design Manager. My speciality is compliance, buildability and pre-construction due to over 8 years being in various site roles.

Southbase helped me by enabling me to work part time with them as a Junior QS whilst I was studying, joining the business in 2018. I spent a few years on smaller school jobs and then moved on to work as a Quantity Surveyor and have been doing that for four years on One NZ Stadium.

I joined Southbase as a BIM Technician, leveraging my structural design and modelling background. Over eight years, I have progressed to BIM Manager, Innovation Manager, and now I am Director of Construction Technology. Starting as a one-person team, I now lead the whole Performance team, driving BIM processes, technology adoption, and project productivity for large-scale projects. My journey reflects continuous growth, innovation, and leadership in advancing construction technology and performance.





**Daniel Foster**Project Manager

I joined Southbase in January 2018 as a Site Engineer. After two projects, in 2019 I was offered the role of a Senior Site Engineer. This allowed me to work closely with project managers to gain the skills needed to progress further. Upon completing the sub-structure of the Massey University Innovation Complex as the on-site lead, I was promoted to Project Manager in 2021. Since taking this role, I have completed - Oceania Football Confederation - New Head Office (\$5.5M | FIFA), Beachlands School roll growth extension (\$6.5M | MoE), Maraetai Beach School roll growth extension, and Project Fern Data Centre (\$125M).



**David Barillaro** Senior Site Manager

I began my journey with Southbase Construction in 2015 as a Carpenter, contributing to various anchor projects across Christchurch during the post-2011 earthquake rebuild. Progressing to a Leading Hand role, I eventually became a Foreman, leading a carpentry team on the new Christchurch library project. My career then advanced to a Site Manager position, where I embraced new challenges, technologies, and management styles, including travelling for projects in the Otago region. Now back in Christchurch, I have taken on the role of Senior Site Manager, recently completing a heritage restoration on the Christchurch Boys High School main block.



**Harley Campbell**Project Commercial Manager

I started with Southbase in 2015 as a Junior QS working part time on The Crossing in Christchurch whilst I was completing my degree in Construction Management (Quantity Surveying). After completing my studies in 2016, I relocated to Auckland as an Intermediate Quantity Surveyor to work on the PPP3 schools project where I was the project QS at Kumeu Primary. In early 2019, I moved to Australia to work in roads and rail where I became a Chartered Quantity Surveyor before returning to Southbase as Senior Quantity Surveyor in 2023 to close out the Project Fern Data Centre. At the back end of 2024, I committed to staying in New Zealand with Southbase as a Commercial Manager as we continue to grow in the North Island region.

**Jennifer Stuart** Commercial Manager

When I first started with Southbase I had just moved out from Scotland. I was initially employed as a Junior Quantity Surveyor to be working with a team. However, this quickly progressed and five months later I was out on site running my first project for Southbase. Running this project successfully was the catalyst for my ongoing career development. I went on to become an Intermediate QS then Senior QS running multiple projects with JQS support. Finally, after completing the University of Canterbury student accommodation I was promoted to my current role as Commercial Manager. I have now been in this role for nearly three years where I lead procurement of key projects and oversee the teams running the day-to-days on the project.



**Jeremy Earle**Construction Manager

I joined Southbase in January of 2014, within the first year of the company's inception when we were a small team of under 20 people. I joined the St Margarets College project initially as Site Manager but was immediately given the responsibility of Project Manager and had great training from many people, but specifically Richard Jack. After the successful completion of this project I was given the opportunity to be the Lead Project Manager for The Crossing project where I would further develop my management skills and construction knowledge. Having delivered this highly complex multi-building project, I was then asked to move into construction management and oversee multiple projects and teams, a real change for me. But again with Richard Jack's support and training I was able to excel in this role. The opportunity then came up to lead the Queenstown Lakes District business and I relocated my family for three years to establish a Southbase team there and deliver some great projects, one being a PPP expansion which was very complex but ultimately very successful. I relocated back to Christchurch in 2023 and now remain Construction Manager but oversee all projects in Queenstown and Christchurch from an operational point of view. I continue to have ability to challenge myself and take on more responsibility. In 2024 I won the NZIOB \$50+ project for my work on Wakatipu High School. I thank Southbase for the opportunities and career progression I've had over the last 11+ years.

Quantity Surveyor

I started at Southbase in 2019 as a Quantity Surveyor. Since then, I have had the opportunity to work on a wide range of projects including schools, university accommodation, a hospital, and retirement village. Being based on site for these projects has provided me with a solid foundation of practical knowledge and experience while working alongside great teams within which there is a strong culture.



**Katie Weekes** Design Technician

I started working at Southbase in 2020 as a Quality Coordinator. I requested to be involved onsite for an introduction for experience. Coming from a Bachelor of Architecture and a Graduate Diploma in Construction Management, my manager introduced me into the Design Engineering Team, which felt like blend of my qualifications. In my new role as Design Coordinator, I was able to develop a lead in the process and learn from a wide range of knowledge from consultants. Managing a team through design phases gave me more confidence in my practice. Since early 2024 the design team has formed its own entity called 'Preformance' incorporating inhouse design, which involves my current role as Design Technician continuing to upskill towards becoming an Architect.



Marcus Beddis North Island Regional Manager

In August 2019 I relocated from Dubai to Auckland to join Southbase as a Senior QS working on the Massey University Innovation Complex. The following year I was promoted to North Island Commercial Manager leading the commercials for all projects in region. This involved negotiation of project Fern, the first D&C data centre in NZ. Then in 2024 I was promoted again, this time to North Island Regional Manager, overall responsibility for the business' performance in the North Island. That October I was also offered (and accepted) shareholding in Southbase! Over this time the regional team has expanded from 20 to 55 people (and still growing); and I progressed from joining the Regional Leadership Team to the Executive Leadership Team.
